The following pages will help you prepare to complete your online registration form. If you will take time to read through this information the registration process will go more smoothly, especially if this is your first time attending. You may even want to print it out and make notes to use as you complete your online registration.

We highly recommend that you complete your registration when you have at least 30 minutes and you are not in a rush or distracted. **Under Registrant Type, everyone (except doctors) will be selecting “Families.”** If you skip over something that should have been filled in, it will tell you the registration is incomplete and highlight in red the questions that need completion. Just scroll through and look for items in red. (There are a few highlighted instructions in red also.) If you are running out of time, you can save the registration and return to finish it later. Also, if you change your mind about a meal or attending an activity, you may return and make edits until May 25, 2017.

It is very important to note that the Early Bird registration rate expires at midnight on April 30, 2017 Eastern Time. It will then automatically change to the regular rate. **Registration must be complete, which includes payment, before the rate expires to take advantage of the reduced early bird rate.** Here are the deadlines:

April 30, 2017 Midnight Eastern Time.....Early Bird Rate Expires

May 25, 2017..... Deadline to Register for 2017 Conference

New Family Orientation

If you are attending the family conference for the first time, please make plans to attend our new family orientation on Wednesday afternoon from 4:30-5:00pm. You will have an opportunity to meet other families and board members, review the schedule and ask questions. This will get you started off with the information you need to gain the most from the days ahead and feel right at home with new friends.

Welcome Reception and Registration

Please note that our long-standing Thursday evening reception has now been moved to Wednesday evening. We kick off with our official welcome to everyone. You will register and pick up your conference packets and name badges prior to the reception. Refreshments and dessert will be served.

THURSDAY JUNE 29, 2017 – RESEARCH & MEET THE EXPERTS

All meals on this day are on your own. The hotel has a restaurant and a Starbucks. There are also restaurants you can walk to right outside the front doors of the hotel in the town square.

Research

You will have the opportunity to participate in research that has the potential to not only help your child but also help others diagnosed with CFC syndrome now and in the future. Imagine! What you do this day could have a significant impact on another child's life and his or her entire family. However, the choice is entirely up to you. If you decide to participate, each researcher will require that you review and sign a consent form for their research. You may ask questions before the research is done so you are fully informed. You are free to opt out at any time.

Enroll in the CFC International Registry

A computer, scanner and staff will be on hand to assist families who would like to enroll in the CFC Registry. CFC International recognizes the importance of global collaboration. One of the goals of the registry is to enable researchers from around the world to work together to speed research progress. The CFC Registry connects all those interested in accelerating CFC syndrome research – affected individuals, families and researchers – with a resource that has never before been available in one place. If you are interested in enrolling, please bring your child's gene mutation testing report if available.

Meet the Expert Appointment Selections

We are fortunate to have so many experts available in person at the conference. Remember that these doctors are not the treating physicians for your child. They are sharing their expert knowledge on the topics you wish to discuss, so come prepared with your most important questions related to CFC syndrome. Please bring medical records in case you wish to share information or have questions on specific reports. If your child has a DNA testing report, please bring it with you.

Following is a list of the experts who have agreed to be available to speak with our families. You will be asked to tell us how many experts you would like to speak with, if any, and to number them in order of preference. Once everyone has registered, this will greatly assist our coordinators in scheduling the appointments for all the families. We cannot guarantee you will speak with your first selection or receive all your choices, but with so many wonderful experts, you will be sure to learn something new!

Once everyone has made their selection of both researchers and experts, a "Passport" will be made with all your appointments and included in your registration packet. We often have waiting lists to get in with certain experts so if you cannot attend after signing up, you need to immediately contact us so others can be given your slot.

REGISTRATION FOR ATTENDING THE FAMILY CONFERENCE

Everyone attending the sessions or eating a meal must register. There is no partial registration. Payment must be made for registration to be complete. There is no paper registration – all registration is done online. You register for the conference by going to our website (www.cfcysndrome.org) and finding the Conference under “News & Events” and then “Conference Information.” No partial payments will be accepted and no holds on medical consult spots or childcare are granted until your registration is complete.

2017 Fundraising Incentive for Families

EXTRA TICKETS FOR THE SATURDAY NIGHT BANQUET/AUCTION/DANCING

Occasionally a few people would like to invite others to attend the Saturday Night Banquet. You may purchase tickets for them with your registration – Adults (13 and older) are \$38 and Children (ages 7-12) are \$19. There is no charge for children ages 0-6 but we ask that you “buy tickets” for them as well so we will have a seat for them. You do not need to purchase banquet tickets if you have registered as Saturday night is included in your registration free. Tickets for this dinner will not be sold on site.

REGISTRATION FOR CHILD CARE & CFC LOUNGE

Onsite childcare services with Corporate Kids [<https://conferencechildcare.com>] is available for the individual with CFC syndrome and their siblings (ages 1-12) on Friday and Saturday. For a nominal fee of \$45 per child, professional caregivers from Corporate Kids Events will care for your children so that you may give your undivided attention to the information presented at the sessions. The actual cost we are billed is \$154 per child so please decide very carefully if your child will access these costly services or if you will bring another

adult to watch your child. Please note: we cannot provide one-on-one childcare or nursing care. You are required to be staying at the hotel and also be on location at the hotel if your child is in childcare! Other guests are not permitted in childcare since it is limited by space and cost. CFC children under 18 are not permitted in the speaking sessions, and caregivers electing to use childcare are required to attend the sessions. The fee is the same for one or both days. Please note that we may need to adjust children from one age group to another depending on the number of children who register. The CFC Lounge (ages 16 and up) is only for individuals with CFC syndrome and siblings may not be part of the Lounge.

CFC Childcare room is for ages 1-15
Sibling Childcare is for ages 1-12
CFC Lounge is for CFC individuals age 16 and up

Children are picked up by parents to enjoy lunch with their families on both days. The CFC Lounge will be in a large suite where we will have adult chaperones, movies, games, and arts and crafts. We have also hired a magician, Zumba instructor and music therapist so everyone will have a great time!

SIBSHOP

The 9th CFC International Family Conference is excited to bring you Sibshops. Often we focus on the needs of the individuals with special needs and their parents. What about the brothers and sisters in the family?

Sibshops are lively, engaging celebrations of the many contributions made by brothers and sisters of kids with special needs. Sibshops acknowledge that being the brother or sister of a person with special needs is for some a good thing, others a not-so-good thing, and for many, somewhere in-between. They reflect a belief that brothers and sisters have much to offer one another — if they are given a chance. Sibshops are lively events for brothers and sisters of kids with special needs. With an emphasis on wellness and fun, Sibshops give kids a chance to meet other sibs, play outrageous games, talk about the good (and not-so-good) parts of having a sib with special needs with others who “get it” and have even more fun!

Sibshops are not therapy, although their effect may be therapeutic for some children. Sibshops acknowledge that most brothers and sisters of people with special needs, like their parents, are doing well, despite the challenges of an illness or disability. Consequently, while Sibshops facilitators always keep an eye open for participants who may need additional services, the Sibshops model takes a wellness approach.

Who participates in Sibshops? The Sibshop program will be offered to siblings ages 7 to 12 on Friday morning.

Who facilitates Sibshops? We will have two trained facilitators. Assisting them will be teen and young adult siblings of individuals with special needs.
